As you read this edition of the Pine Bough, spring has arrived, and the end of the school year is fast approaching.

The Seventh Grade enjoyed their trip to Medieval Times as they made connections to their World Cultures' curriculum. They enjoyed the food, fun, and friends. We would like to thank parents for supporting this worthwhile day out of the building.

Friday, May 26^{th} , will be our Annual Pine Grove Middle School 8^{th} grade Sports Day. This is tentatively scheduled from 9:45-2:00 pm. In the event of bad weather, the rain date is Friday, June 2^{nd} . At the conclusion of our festivities, representatives from our local high schools will be sharing information about fall sports programs and eligibility. Students who do not meet set expectations will not be invited to participate in Sports Day. Questions about eligibility should be directed to Mrs. Farmer. Students not attending Sports Day will attend classes during the day instead of going outside.

On June 14, 2017, pending BCPS's last day of school announcement, we will be holding our annual 8th Grade Farewell Assembly at 5:00 pm in the auditorium of Perry Hall High School. Due to seating capacity at the high school, each student will be eligible to receive two guest tickets for the program. All 8th grade students will receive a letter from Ms. Nelson outlining proof of residency requirements to move from middle school to high school. Tickets will be issued to students after proof of residency has been completed as outlined in that letter. However, please do not contact Mrs. Sipes regarding this process prior to receiving this letter. We ask that any parents who are not planning to use their tickets to please notify Ms. Roberts, our 8th grade guidance counselor, or Ms. Sipes, our guidance secretary, so that we may ensure all available seats are utilized.

It is our hope to create a dignified event which honors all of our students. Faculty and students will be seated separately from parents and guests. Please note that students will not be crossing the stage or coming to the podium. We ask that parents and guests conduct themselves in an appropriate manner and clap for all students equally and at the appropriate time. Please also note that there is no formal reception being coordinated by the school.

Health News from the Nurse

A few reminders about whether or not to send your child to school.

Students must wait at least 24 hours after a fever - temperature greater than 100°F without any medication, to return to school.

Due to the epidemic proportions of vomiting and diarrhea in BCPS, the department of health recommends that students stay home from school for 48 hours after the last episode of vomiting and or diarrhea. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

ATTENTION 6th GRADE PARENTS:

All 6th graders must have a meningococcal (MCV4) vaccine and a Tdap vaccine **before** the beginning of 7th grade (2016 – 2017 school year). If you have not already done so and your child has already had the vaccines please request an updated vaccine record from your child's pediatrician and forward them to Betsy Rudolf, RN in the health suite, or you can also fax to the health suite at 410-668-5237. If your child has an upcoming appointment please make sure to ask his/her doctor about these important vaccines. Those students who do NOT have the required vaccines received a letter the week of March 13th. Thank you for your attention to this matter. PBIS Committee News

Our Character Education Program has a new name......TEN MINUTE TUESDAY! The PBIS committee creates lessons based on a particular character trait, timely event, or perceived need in our school. The most recent Ten Minute Tuesday topics have included *Common Courtesy, Respect in Non-Classroom Environments* and *When is Bullying Not Bullying*. Lessons are taught on Tuesday mornings during homeroom and are a way for students and teachers to connect about topics other than curriculum.

Got TRACS? Students have been using TRACS for a variety of reasons at PGMS. In addition to purchasing items in the school store and sitting at the TRAC table at lunch, TRACS can be used for special drawings which take place monthly. Our most recent prizes have been 8 seats for free at a special table in the cafeteria and an Echo Dot. Our next drawing will be for a JBL speaker. All students can enter to win the speaker during lunch shifts.

Appropriate Dress Reminder

Students are expected to wear appropriate attire. The following are not considered appropriate:

- Hats
- Bandanas
- Halters or bare midriffs
- Low-cut tops
- Short-shorts or short skirts
- Flip-Flops

Skirts/dresses/shorts must be the length of the wearer's arm (to the bottom of the middle finger-tip when arm is at side) pants are to be worn appropriately at waist; pants should not be excessively long as to pose a safety concern for self or others, nor have slits/slashes that expose skin

Clothing/accessories with reference to sex, profanity, drugs, alcohol, violence, or tobacco are not permitted. Clothing/accessories may not convey messages that express hate, racial slurs, or sexual harassment. All students should wear shoes that allow for safe movement while in school. NO undergarments may be visible at any time. The final say on inappropriate dress will be determined by the administration.


